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DON'T YOU DARE NOT VOTE!

Thirty-five days from today is Election Day. Finally! It's been a long slog through the overly long primaries. Even a political junkie like me gets bored once in a while listening to the pundits and the pollster pontificate. And I get angry at the media for playing "Gotcha!" or focusing on positive or negative sound bites instead of dealing with the issues.
